# The Furniture Bank



The Furniture Bank is online. Items are listed under the "Furniture Bank" tab on our website. Currently we have eleven (11) items available. The cost in time dollars is as follows:

10 time dollars for a sofa, dining suite and bedroom set5 time dollars for a chair, occasional table, electronic equipment and objects d'art

**1 time dollar** for individual/unique items that don't fit the above criteria

An Amazing Gift by David Gray

A major obstacle to the success of The Tapestry Furniture Bank is the risk of proliferating bed bug infestations via donated and refurbished goods and furniture. A simple internet search quickly revealed how wide spread the problem has become and how it crosses all economic, social, and cultural boundaries. The bed bug epidemic has forced many non-profits to discontinue accepting furniture donations. Without the option of donating to their favorite non-profit, many items are simply thrown away. Only two options exist to insure no infestation: Chemical or thermal treatments. Using only electrical energy, the thermal remediation technique is far more environmentally friendly and research shows it to be more effective as well.

The Tapestry Board of Directors felt confident that assuring safe handling was the key to The Furniture Bank success. To provide this assurance, the idea of equipping a trailer modified as a portable thermal remediation device came to mind. With this trailer, donations could be collected as well as treated. We went on a fact finding mission to Minnesota to explore thermal remediation equipment, designed specifically for eradication of bed bugs. We are pleased to report that we came back with much more than just facts!

TempAir, Inc. of Burnsville MN (Minneapolis suburb) was extremely generous. They agreed to refurbish and donate several outdated thermal heaters and two temperature monitoring systems. In addition to providing much of the equipment needed for the trailer, Temp Air's generous donation will also provide equipment for a stationary treatment chamber at a physical location, once the furniture bank secures space. What is even more special about the donated heaters is that these donations were about to be torn apart for salvage and disposal, eliminating competition for their newly designed equipment. TempAir's donation keeps the heaters themselves from the landfill and helps insure many other items will be saved from similar demise.

TempAir also spent nearly a full afternoon helping us refine the trailer design to optimize effectiveness. We learned that the 3 keys to successful eradication are heat, monitoring, and air movement. With the donation of the heaters and temperature monitoring equipment, two of the three key elements have been met. We still need to secure a trailer and air moving equipment (fans designed to operate in high temperature environment) but are well on our way to making this idea a reality.

The Tapestry is extremely appreciative of TempAir's generous donation. I'm excited to be part of this endeavor for our community, what an amazing gift!
